

Transforming Walk with God (Isaiah 40:8; Romans 12:2)

A transforming walk with God begins with making a personal commitment to know and follow Jesus Christ. We consciously rely on the Holy Spirit to inspire and alter us through corporate and



individual prayer. The Holy Spirit also gives us insight and understanding into the Word of God and the God of the Word. We believe that the Bible is the Word of God and is the only perfect rule for faith, doctrine and conduct. We look to the Bible to inform and ground our understanding of who God is and how he invites us to participate in his efforts to heal our broken lives and world. We extend grace and support to one another knowing we are all in process of being renewed and transformed by God. Therefore, we are committed to creating space for spiritual formation for all ages including heart-felt worship, Biblical and challenging preaching, Sunday School, Wednesday night ministries, prayer groups and small group Bible studies.
